REPORT OF THE MAYOR: Mayor Hruby reported the City of Brecksville has been named a Tree City for another year. Arborist Joe Dwyer and Service Director Weidig have worked very hard to maintain and promote a healthy tree canopy in the City of Brecksville.

Mayor Hruby said the administration and safety services attended a presentation today with the Weather Service regarding the predicted snow & rain event. The weather service is projecting less rain and more snow, estimated between 9 inches and 14 inches of snow. Another briefing will take place Wednesday and updates will be provided on the City's Website and Facebook account. Mayor Hruby said it is recommended to stay off the roads if possible.

Mayor Hruby said the purchase of property adjacent to the Police Department has been completed.

Mayor Hruby said accusations of wrongdoing by a newly elected Councilmember has been posted to social media. Mayor Hruby said he was made aware of the accusations and investigated the issue. Mayor Hruby contacted Councilmembers and Service Director Weidig to see if the accusations were correct. Councilmember Stucky said he was the Councilmember to which the accusations were directed. Councilmember Stucky provided photos and an invoice from the private company he hires to plow his driveway. Service Director Weidig said the Service Department does not plow private driveways. Occasionally when requested, the Service Department may clear a driveway apron when City plows have blocked access to the street. Councilmember Stucky asked if the Service Department would plow the driveways of senior citizens. Service Director Weidig said the Human Services Department has a program that Senior Citizens may apply for plowing services. Service Director Weidig said the Service Department will only plow private property in the event of a true emergency. Mayor Hruby said the person that posted the accusation has been notified that it was not a City plow, however the posting has not been removed.

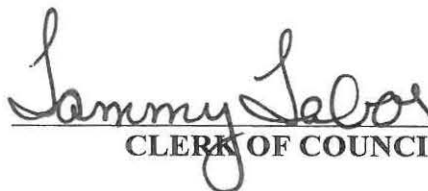
