Lt. Zimlich worked as a volunteer part-time Fire Fighter for the City of Brecksville approximately 41 years ago. Mayor Hruby said Lt. Zimlich left to pursue a position in another agency before returning to a full time position with Brecksville. Lt. Zimlich was appointed to the position of firefighter/EMT in the City of Brecksville on February 11, 1990 and promoted to Lieutenant/Paramedic on January 19, 1999. Lt. Zimlich served as a technical rescue team member of the Southwest Emergency Response Team and a State of Ohio certified Fire Safety Inspector and Fire Instructor. Lt. Zimlich led many trainings for the fire department and assisted greatly in the fire prevention program. Lt. Zimlich has been responsible for all radio equipment and was the liaison with emergency dispatchers and performed many administrative duties, always with great attention to detail. The Zimlich family has a history of public service with Lt. Zimlich's father Walter, serving as a Brecksville Councilmember, Constable, Marshall, and Fire Fighter. Lt. Zimlich's brother Alan retired as a Fire Fighter. Mayor Hruby thanked Lt. Zimlich for his years of service to the City. Council President Harwood presented Lt. Brian Zimlich with a clock and Resolution recognizing his years of service. Lt. Zimlich introduced his wife Nancy and his children Sean and Molly and his granddaughter Maggie. Lt. Mayor Hruby said Bill Goodrich was the eighth Police Chief in the City of Brecksville. Mayor Hruby said Police Chief Goodrich was the first Patrol Officer he hired as Mayor in the City of Brecksville. Police Chief Goodrich was hired in 1988 shortly after serving in the United States Air Force. Police Chief Goodrich was promoted to Sergeant on November 9, 1997 and then to Police Chief on June 2, 2015. Police Chief Goodrich's retirement was effective May 3, 2021. Mayor Hruby said during Police Chief Goodrich's service he served as a Patrol Officer, Patrol Sergeant, Honor Guard Member, Youth Services Officer and the Safety Town Officer for 19 years. Police Chief Goodrich was also involved with Shop With a Cop for 25 years, the first DARE Officer in Brecksville and the Juvenile Officer, serving 19 years in that capacity. Police Chief Goodrich took on the responsibility of Sunny, the department's K-9, when the K-9 Officer left the City of Brecksville. Police Chief Goodrich also served as a SWAT Team Tactical Officer and negotiator for several years. As Police Chief he served 6 years. During that time Police Chief Goodrich hired Eight (8) full time officers, saw (5) of his officers promoted. He worked with his family and friends to create the new Safety Town. Police Chief Goodrich was part of the team responsible for the new Police Station, the transition to the Chagrin Valley Dispatch Center and the transition to 800 Radios. Mayor Hruby said Police Chief Goodrich's dedication to the City has always been evident. Mayor Hruby thanked Police Chief Goodrich for his service and wished him a long & healthy retirement.

Police Chief Goodrich thanked the men and women of law enforcement who helped and supported him during his career. The Lieutenants Dan Jereb, Bob Johnson and Stan Korinek were very supportive as part of the command staff when he became Police Chief. Police Chief Goodrich said there were (5) Sergeants and Patrolmen for doing a great job. Police Chief Goodrich said he was happy that the members of the department stayed safe & healthy during his watch. Police Chief Goodrich said the City Family, Department heads, and staff are a team that works together and truly cares about each other. Police Chief Goodrich thanked Mayor Hruby for the guidance, knowledge and wisdom that he imparted on Chief Goodrich. Police Chief Goodrich thanked his family and acknowledged that it is not easy being the family member of a Police Officer. Police Chief Goodrich introduced his parents Bill and Marybeth, and recognized them for the profound effect they had on his life and career. Chief Goodrich's children Bill, Megan and Avery and (7) grandchildren were his strength, inspiration and energy during every shift. Chief Goodrich plans to spend more time with them in retirement. Police Chief Goodrich introduced his wife Janelle for knowing what to say and when to say it.

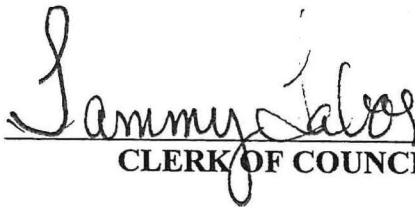
