Kevin Lynch gave the following update regarding AT&T. A new program will be coming out where customers will now be able to watch more videos on their smart phones and portable devices, whether at home, on the road or wherever they choose. A package will be coming out at the end of the year for \$35/month and it is a totally wireless streaming video program. There will be a selection of channels to choose from to watch anytime, anywhere. This service is targeting those that utilize only their mobile devices, no landlines or cable TV. The cost may be introductory and may require a contract. No other equipment would be required. Just download the “app” watch the data usage and use Wi-Fi whenever possible. The \$35 bundle would use AT&T or another provider for cell phone service.

Franchise Fees

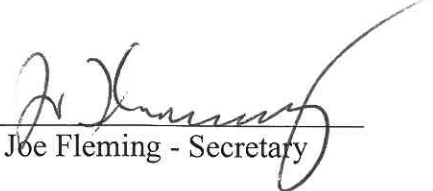
The commission reviewed the 3rd quarter fees for 2016 and determined that fees remained about the same.

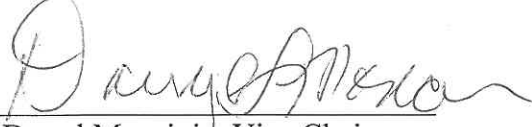
Open Forum
