REPORT OF THE MAYOR: Mayor Hruby reported the weather service has said there were 80-100 MPH winds during last Sunday's storm event. There is extensive damage throughout the City and City property. Many members of the City staff came in after the storm and helped with clean up. Police Chief Goodrich was looking to help clean catch basins, Engineer Wise and Human Services Director Paciorek came in to offer assistance. The City of Independence offered the use of a branch chipper to assist with clean up. Mayor Hruby thanked all of the staff that came out and helped with clean up. Mayor Hruby said he has heard concerns from citizens that Code Red did not send out a warning in advance of the storm. Mayor Hruby said there was a warning sent for the storm that came through later in the evening. The Mayor said he will be asking why the Weather Service and Code Red did not recognize the strong winds that came through and issue an alert. The schools were closed on Monday due to power outages and closed roads. Many residents were without electricity for some time and most are back on-line currently. There was damage to the Town Square. Many trees and Christmas decorations already in place at the square were lost to the strong winds. 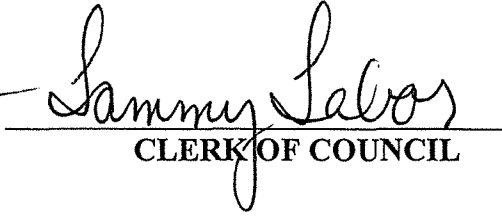
